CIJA's Parliamentary Internship Program is an annual competition for university graduates with an interest in governmental affairs. The program provides Members of Parliament with highly qualified assistants, and gives university graduates an opportunity to supplement their knowledge of Parliament with practical, hands-on experience.

Intern responsibilities include working with Members of the House of Commons in a variety of areas, including parliamentary committees, correspondence and constituency duties. Graduates of the program are better able to significantly contribute to Canadian public life.

Placements will begin this fall and last about nine months. To be eligible you must be a permanent resident or citizen of Canada, have recently completed a university degree and have an interest in Parliament. There are only 8 positions available, so apply now. One spot will be reserved for a candidate who will make a significant contribution to Canadian Indigenous Affairs. Please indicate in your application if you are interested in this position.
